## **Program Guidelines**

## Guideline:

- 1 It is the responsibility of the licensee to inform the Health Professionals' Services Program (HPSP)
- 2 agreement monitor if she is pregnant within 6 months of the expected due date. The maternity
- 3 exemption is as follows:
  - 1. For a vaginal delivery, the licensee is expected to resume toxicology testing and attending required treatment and support group programs by the sixth day following delivery.
  - 2. For cesarean delivery, the licensee is expected to resume toxicology testing and attending required treatment and support group programs by the tenth day following delivery.
  - 3. If there are medical reasons that prevent the licensee from resuming compliance to the monitoring requirements within the above time frames, licensee must provide a physician's statement indicating the reason why the licensee cannot participate in the above requirements and provide a date when licensee can resume the monitoring program.
  - 4. The time that a licensee spends on maternity leave does not count toward the 21-day exemptions per year.
